We urge our church family to join us for the final meeting planned for this process on Wednesday evening, April 15, 2015 at 7:00 PM.





For Personal Reflection and Discussion with Friends and Family:

What do you find horrifying about the judgments that follow the sounding of the seven trumpets? Revelation 9:20-21 expresses the incredulous observation that even these horrific judgments did not bring many to repentance. What is repentance? What are the qualities of genuine repentance? Why are we so slow to repent? What place does ongoing repentance have in the life of a Christian? (See Isaiah 57:15) What is God saying to you about a contrite heart?

In Preparation for Good Friday and Easter Sunday:

Despite the four Gospel writers devoting one third of their content to the last week of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, there are still gaps in our understanding of everything that took place that week and when. Nonetheless, imagining events as we read through Passion Week can be an effective preparation for grasping more fully the significance of Jesus' death and resurrection. Parallel passages can be explored as well.

RRCC Library

It is a pleasure for our library committee of five members to promote books and encourage reading. We enjoy our highly visible location in the foyer of RRCC. We also act as an informal extension to our greeters by answering questions and providing directions for new attendees who wander into the library. Currently we have a number of younger families who come in and borrow books and DVDs. Of course we really appreciate our regular readers too!

The behind-the-scenes work in keeping the library current and optimally functional averages at least five hours per week. This includes weeding out-dated and worn-out items, reading reviews and ordering/purchasing new stock, processing new materials for circulation, and tracking down overdue items. Also making the library attractive with seasonal displays is an opportunity to be creative. Since last fall we have changed over to a Resource Mate computer circulation system. Obviously this entailed many hours of work as data was converted from our old Excel database. We very much appreciate the expertise of Bob Regier, Pastor Darren, and Sandra Nelson who assisted us in getting our system up and running.

It continues to be a challenge to raise the profile of the library and hopefully generate more readers. We try to "advertise" the library in as many ways as we can. Every week the church bulletin highlights a current book, usually non-fiction, that hopefully will grab interest from our congregation. On occasion we have provided book lists to support ministry themes such as a sermon series. We would like to do more of this in future, and would welcome requests from kid's ministry, care groups, youth, men's ministry etc. We welcome suggestions and input to help us meet the needs of RRCC members and attendees.
